With over forty meticulously preserved historical structures, including homes, mills, and workshops, many relocated before the St. Lawrence Seaway project, the village offers an immersive journey into the past.

Today, visiting Upper Canada Village is a captivating time-travel experience, transporting visitors to the 1860s. Authentic buildings and activities vividly bring the past to life, offering a glimpse into the daily lives of its inhabitants.

LEARNING CENTRES



Discovery Centre: Exhibits setting the context for your visit, including the War of 1812 and history of the settlement along the St. Lawrence River.

Croil Barn: Exhibits presenting the development of agricultural technology, rural life and leisure in the last half of the 19th century.

Signal Tower: Learn about long-distance communication in the 1860s and see an elevated view of the Village.

Family Activity Centre: Open daily July & August. Hands-on activities for the whole family.




Crysler Hall: Visit two exhibits on Black history in Eastern Ontario"
